<b>Technical Adjustments:</b>								
1. In Rider 8, Benefits Proportionality Audit Requirement, update references from benefits proportionality "by fund" to "by method of finance."								
2. In House Bill 1, state contributions were allocated to The University of Texas System, the Texas A&M University System, and institutions of higher education in the Employees Retirement System (ERS) Group Benefits Program (GBP) using inaccurate ERS premium rates for member & child and member & spouse. This correction would result in a reallocation of funding among the institutions, and revised proration rates would be 80.6 percent of ERS premiums for The University of Texas and Texas A&M University Systems and 81.0 percent of ERS premiums for institutions of higher education in the ERS GBP. 1. TEXAS Grant Program. The exceptional item request would support approximately 70 percent of eligible students, with a 2.5 percent increase each year to the target award amount, currently \$5,000. <b>House Bill 1 funding level is \$786.5 million in General Revenue, which maintains the 2018-19 General Revenue funding level and would support approximately 58 percent of eligible students at the \$5,000 target award amount and 54 percent at the increased target award amount.</b>	\$ 112,636,791	\$ 112,636,791

3. <b>IT Application Portfolio Modernization.</b> The exceptional item would provide the agency with one-time funding for the hiring of two contract developers to complete the implementation of the modern architecture design and integrate existing applications into the new framework. The agency reports that the current application portfolio is complex, costly, and only moderately effective and is comprised of a wide array of disparate and disconnected applications.	\$ 1,040,000	\$ 1,040,000						
4. <b>GradTX Consortium.</b> GradTX supports the identification and recruitment of individuals who have earned a substantial number of college credits (90+ SCH at universities and 45+ SCH at 2-year colleges), but have left higher education without earning a degree. The exceptional item would be used to create a consortium of 3-5 institutions around the state prepared to support these students. These funds would be used for the development of a transcribing tool, outreach and technology to address these issues. <b>House Bill 1 includes \$300,000 for the Grad TX program.</b>	\$ 500,000	\$ 500,000						
5. <b>Support Transfer Initiatives.</b> The agency's Academic, Quality, and Workforce Division engages in three activities related to transfer. Fields of Study, Programs of Study and Learning Outcome Workshops. Committees of faculty are formed to create or revise student learning outcomes of courses associated with the development of these activities. The exceptional item would be used to defray some of the costs associated with faculty participation in these committees. <b>House Bill 1 includes \$230,794 for Fields of Study and \$60,000 for Learning Outcomes. Programs of Study has historically been supported by federal funds, approximately \$20,000 per year.</b>	\$ 50,000	\$ 50,000						

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6. <b>Support 60x30TX Regional Strategies.</b> In fiscal year 2018, the agency developed and introduced regional 60x30TX targets for each of the ten higher education regions in the state. Regional targets provided guidance to institutions of higher education, as well as K-12 and workforce stakeholders, about the progress needed to achieve statewide goals and targets. The exceptional item request would be used to award 4-5 regional target grants each year of the biennium through a competitive process to launch the regional strategies that have been developed at a level of \$100,000 to \$150,000 per region. <b>House Bill 1 does not include funding for this program.</b>	\$ 1,300,000	\$ 1,300,000						
7. <b>Texas Success Initiative Assessment (TSIA) Enhancement and Success.</b> The exceptional item request would be used to issue a Request for Application (RFA) and require upgraded components to the TSIA which the agency reports includes the following:  1) One comprehensive diagnostic aligned to the National Adult Basic and Secondary Standards and Texas College and Career Readiness Standards, 2) Easy access to and transportability of TSIA results for students and institutions, 3) Integration of the reading and writing sections with an essay resulting in one composite score, and 4) Appropriate and robust standard setting.	\$ 1,000,000	\$ 1,000,000						

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8. <b>Access to Out-of State Student Data.</b> The exceptional item request would cover the costs associated with the acquisition of National Student Clearinghouse data. Currently the agency only collects data from colleges and universities in Texas and does not have access to data for students who graduate in Texas but who enroll in higher education out-of-state. This data could be matched to TEA and THECB records to understand out-of-state enrollment and help explain if student enrollment and completion patterns are changing. <b>House Bill 1 does not include funding for this program.</b>	\$ 270,000	\$ 270,000						
9. <b>Enhance Compliance Monitoring.</b> The exceptional item request would support the hiring of four FTEs to support the agency's compliance monitoring function established in Senate Bill 215, 83rd Legislature. Under this function, the agency is required to perform risk-based monitoring of the funds it disburses to institutions of higher education as well as examining the accuracy of data reported by institutions that are used for funding or policy-making decisions, such as formula funding allocations. Currently the agency's compliance team consists of four full-time staff. <b>House Bill 1 includes \$685,400 for compliance monitoring.</b>	\$ 707,450	\$ 707,450						
10. <b>Financial Literacy Initiatives.</b> The exceptional item request would support the identification, administration, and scaling of effective institutional financial literacy initiatives focused on promoting a better understanding of reducing student debt and how to pay for training and education after high school. <b>House Bill 1 includes \$50,000 for these initiatives.</b>	\$ 100,000	\$ 100,000						

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11. <b>Open Education Resources (OER) Repository.</b> The exceptional item request would support the development of a repository for Open Education Resources (OER) using OER Commons, an existing resource. The first year costs, \$160,000, would support one FTE to set up and maintain the repository and pay for set-up fees to OER Commons. The second year funds, \$90,000, would be used to support an FTE for maintenance of the repository and ongoing maintenance fees to OER Commons. <b>House Bill 1 does not include funding for this program.</b>	\$ 250,000	\$ 250,000						
12. <b>Open Education Resources (OER) Grants.</b> The exceptional item would support additional grants to faculty for the development of OER courses materials. The agency reports that OER essentially results in course materials that are free to students, removing a major barrier to course completion. <b>House Bill 1 includes \$212,049 for Open Educational Resources Grants.</b>	\$ 200,000	\$ 200,000						
13. <b>Family Practice Residency Program.</b> The exceptional item request would increase the funding per resident from \$6,236 to \$7,600. The agency reports there are an estimated 773 family practice residents supported through this program. <b>House Bill 1 includes \$10,000,000 for the Family Practice Residency Program.</b>	\$ 2,000,000	\$ 2,000,000						

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14. <b>Facilities Contract Lease Extension.</b> The agency is being assigned by the Texas Facilities Commission to occupy a portion of the one of the new buildings in the capitol complex. The first phase is expected to be completed around 2022 and 2023. The current ten year lease of the existing THECB leased facility expires on June 30, 2020. A contract/lease extension will be required to allow the THECB to occupy the current leased building until the capitol complex building is completed. The exceptional item will support the additional costs of negotiating terms of less than five years and the inclusion of a termination clause that will allow the THECB to vacate the lease earlier than contracted. The agency reports the fiscal year 2020 lease payment is estimated to be \$1,519,000.	\$ 150,000	\$ 150,000						
<b>Rider Revisions Requested by Agency:</b>								
1. <b>B-On-Time Program-Public.</b> The agency requests appropriation authority in Rider #34, B-On-Time Program-Public for B-On-Time balances. The estimated balance in the B-On-Time Account is \$126.8 million. The Comptroller has indicated that once the account is abolished on September 1, 2020, the remaining funds will not be swept to General Revenue but there could be no more deposits or appropriation from the account. The Comptroller would also not allow expenditures, as the account will not legally exist after September 1, 2020. The agency is requesting to have these funds appropriated to the agency by August 31, 2020 and distributed to institutions with the requirement that they use the funds for financial aid.	\$ 126,826,196	\$ 126,826,196						

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2. <b>B-On-Time Program-Private.</b> The agency requests to modify language in Rider #44, B-On-Time Private, to allow excess funds in the program to be transferred to the Tuition Equalization Grant Program. House Bill 1 funding for the B-On-Time Program Private is \$200,000 in General Revenue and would support approximately 40 students.								
3. <b>Professional Nursing Shortage Reduction Program.</b> The agency requests to eliminate rider language dealing with the Over 70 graduation rate and Under 70 graduation programs.								
4. <b>Mathways Project.</b> The agency requests to lower the transfer amount in Rider #41 from \$200,000 per year to \$100,000 per year.								
5. <b>Texas Collegiate License Plate Scholarships.</b> The agency requests to modify language in Rider #17, that money associated with out of state license plates will be transferred to TEXAS Grants.								
6. <b>For-Profit Repository.</b> The agency requests a new rider that would allow the Higher Education Coordinating Board to charge a fee to individuals requesting academic records from closed institutions. The fees would cover the cost of the expense of maintenance, retrieval, reproduction and mailing of the student academic record. The fee would require statutory change.
