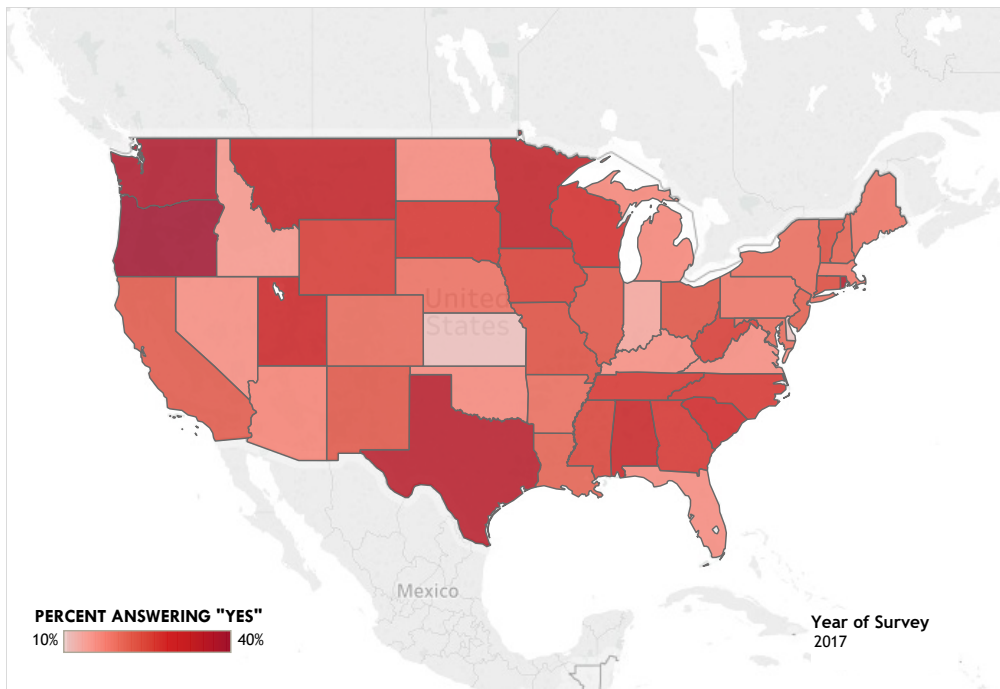

Overview

The effect of active military service can have a profound effect on veterans and require programs and services to help the adjustment to civilian life and employment. The Current Population Survey (CPS) of the U.S. Census Bureau collects sample information in its Veteran Supplement on the involvement of veterans (ages 18-65) in finding a job or obtaining job-related training since leaving active duty in the last four years.
