

SAVINGS RELATED TO CSSB 30

Fiscal year 2023 supplemental appropriations in the Committee Substitute for SB 30 (CSSB 30) total \$5,006.7 million in General Revenue Funds and \$11,852.3 million in All Funds. After consideration of these supplemental appropriations, remaining 2022-23 biennial General Revenue Funds capacity subject to the tax spending limit is \$5.6 million.

Appropriations include \$1,445.3 million in Federal Funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), leaving \$3,954.7 million in remaining ARPA funding.
